Instrumental Group Lessons and Band Ensemble. Foothill Band Program is the wind and percussion instrumental portion of our music enrichment program. Children have the opportunity to receive Beginning - Advanced Group Lessons on the instrument of their choice and experience being part of a Band Ensemble, performing in concerts, school assemblies, and a parade too. Instruments include Woodwinds (flute, clarinet, saxophone), Brass (trumpet, trombone), and Percussion (drum).

Weekly group lessons are taught by professional teacher-musicians hired through Goleta Union School District. Each student attends a half-hour group lesson, and a 1-hour band rehearsal each week. We have a Beginning Band and an Advanced Band Ensemble. Each student is also assigned to a group lesson on a specific morning of the week (ex: Clarinets on Wednesdays, etc.). The lesson hour is divided into 2 half-hour group sessions, one for beginning students and one for advanced students. The class schedule will be provided to all enrolled families, and posted in the Parent Square Band Group. Fee is the program cost divided by actual participation, so more students means lower cost, but it breaks down to approximately \$6 per class (per student). Approx \$430/year. \$100 deposit is required with the enrollment form and will be credited towards the student's tuition fee. The fee covers the 31 weeks of lessons, band ensemble rehearsals, 2 concerts, 1 parade, and school assemblies. After the Enrollment Deadline (9/15), the Band Coordinator will divide the program cost by the number of enrolled students to determine the per student fee, and contact enrolled families with final fee information and their remaining balance due. Enrollment & Deadline: **Open enrollment is every year in September only.** Forms are sent out in Friday Folders, posted online in the Parent Square Foothill Band Program Group under the File Tab, and in the Office. Forms must be returned with deposit by the Enrollment Deadline: Friday September 15th Program & Contact Info: Full details online in ParentSquare Foothill Band Program Group.

They learn about construction of buildings, machines, and 3D models, as they develop spatial awareness, problem solving and innovation skills and an understanding of balance, gravity, form, design, geometry and physics.
